# Part 1 - Yaakov's Childhood and Striving for Bechora (Elder Child Status)

### The Birth - Foreshadowing

#### Genesis 25:23-26

(23) and the LORD answered her, "Two nations are in your womb, Two separate peoples shall issue from your body; One people shall be mightier than the other. And the older shall serve the younger." (24) When her time to give birth was at hand. there were twins in her womb. (25) The first one emerged red, like a hairy mantle all over; so they named him Esau. (26) Then his brother emerged, holding on to the heel of Esau; so they named him Jacob, Isaac was sixty years old when they were born.

#### Genesis 25:28-33

(28) Isaac favored Esau because he had a taste for game; but Rebekah favored Jacob. (29) Once when Jacob was cooking a stew, Esau came in from the open, famished. (30) And Esau said to Jacob, "Give me some of that red stuff to gulp down, for I am famished"—which is why he was named Edom. (31) Jacob said, "First sell me your birthright." (32) And Esau said, "I am at the point of death, so of what use is my birthright to me?" (33) But Jacob said, "Swear to me first." So he swore to him, and sold his birthright to Jacob.
